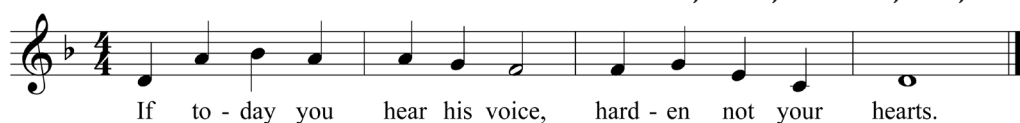
FIRST READING

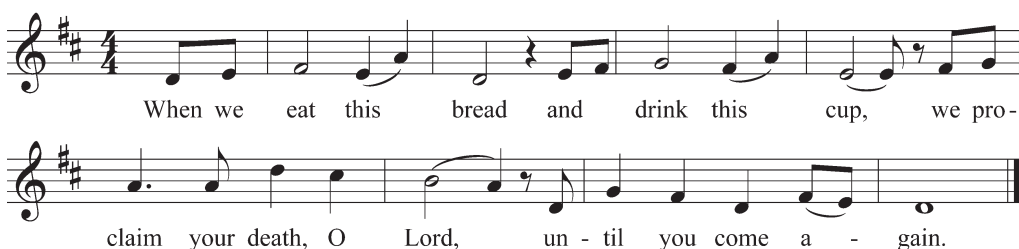


